Coverack school is lucky to have a Parent, Teacher and Friend's association which was set up to connect the school, it's pupils and teachers to the wider community and to bring people together to work towards a common goal. Its other vital role is to raise funds to enrich and enhance the pupil's primary school experience and bridge the gap for much needed extras that Government funding can't hope to cover in a very small rural school such as ours.



#### Fisherman's Rest Update

Since our last update the Rest is looking amazing and almost completely refurbished. It has been insulated to a very high standard by Hugh. The rotten water-logged beam has been replaced. Several volunteers arrived early one morning to help get the new beam in position with Raymond's digger doing the lifting! Naturally our official photographer was there to record this momentous occasion. The new kitchen is in and the water has been reconnected by Pip Kevern. The flooring has been polished and the walls painted. The dark wooden ceiling has been painted so everywhere looks lighter and fresher. The once rotten wooden cupboards at the back of the room are now used for storage, including the marquees. Hugh made new windows where the old kitchen was and new stripy blue curtains make the other windows more cheerful. The huge oar which was once used in the old lifeboats is hung from the ceiling.

#### Coverack Village—Businesses and the Community

Whether you are local or on holiday, a regular visitor or here for the first time...please try to use what is available in Coverack village. We are very fortunate in having a wonderful seascape, beach and a mix of independent businesses and voluntary organisations which combine to make Coverack what it is today.

**Car parking:** Due to erosion there is now very little parking available at the Harbour side of the village. If possible please park in car parks at North Corner, on the right as you enter the village, leaving the few spaces in the village for those who can't walk far. The car parks have honesty boxes and are run by the Parish Council, contributions are used for projects within the Parish and help towards the upkeep of the public toilets in the village.

There is an enclosed play area with swings and a slide, by the Lambeage Hall, on the left as you go up School Hill. At low tide there is a beautiful sandy beach and if the tide is in, the harbour is well worth a visit, although it should be noted that the harbour is privately owned and run by a board of local directors who allow the public to use the working harbour, please take care.

**Two sets of Public Toilets are** maintained by the Parish Council, one near the harbour and one by the Coach Car Park on North Corner side of the village. A Public phone box is near the public toilets by the harbour.

**Post Office Services** are available in St Peter's Hall on a Monday and Thursday afternoon between 1:30pm and 4:30pm. Please use these facilities so that we can continue to have Post Office facilities in the village.

**Post boxes:** Next to Coverack Village stores; at North Corner by the Bus shelter and at Penwartha estate at the top of the hill.

**Cash:** There is a cash machine in The Paris. Some shops offer a cash back service.
